One of the more prevalent crimes during the fall season is package theft. See the attached flyer for crime prevention tips.

As a rule of thumb, if a crime or suspicious situation is occurring or has just occurred, call 911. The non-emergency number is for reporting past incidents where an immediate police response is not necessary.

Emergency = 911

Non-Emergency = 646-5100 (Please save in your mobile phone.)

The Richmond Police Department wants to remind residents that crime prevention starts at home. Package thefts from doorsteps and front porches during the day time hours when many victims are away from their home. Here is a list of things you can do to help prevent that:

- Choose an alternate destination
- Have packages delivered to a family member's home, your workplace or to a neighbour you trust.
- Request a signature upon delivery
- But remember: in many cases, the receiver must ask the shipper to make the request.
- Encourage your family and your neighbors to pick up delivered packages as soon as possible after they are dropped off on your doorstep.
- Try to track your packages.** By doing this, you might even be able to be present at the time of delivery. Many mail carriers allow you to track your shipment online at the following websites:
