Sector 411 had a significant decrease in violent crimes and property crimes this cycle. We went from 7 violent crimes to 6 violent crimes for a 14% decrease. We also went from 44 property crimes to 27 property crimes for a 39% decrease (see slide two for the details). Unfortunately, despite these overall great numbers we still had a murder in the 700 block of Northside Avenue (see slide three for the details on that crime).

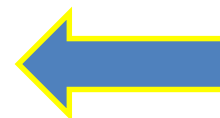
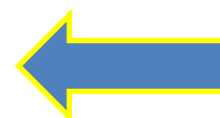

Victim and Offender Identified in Domestic-Related Homicide, Suicide

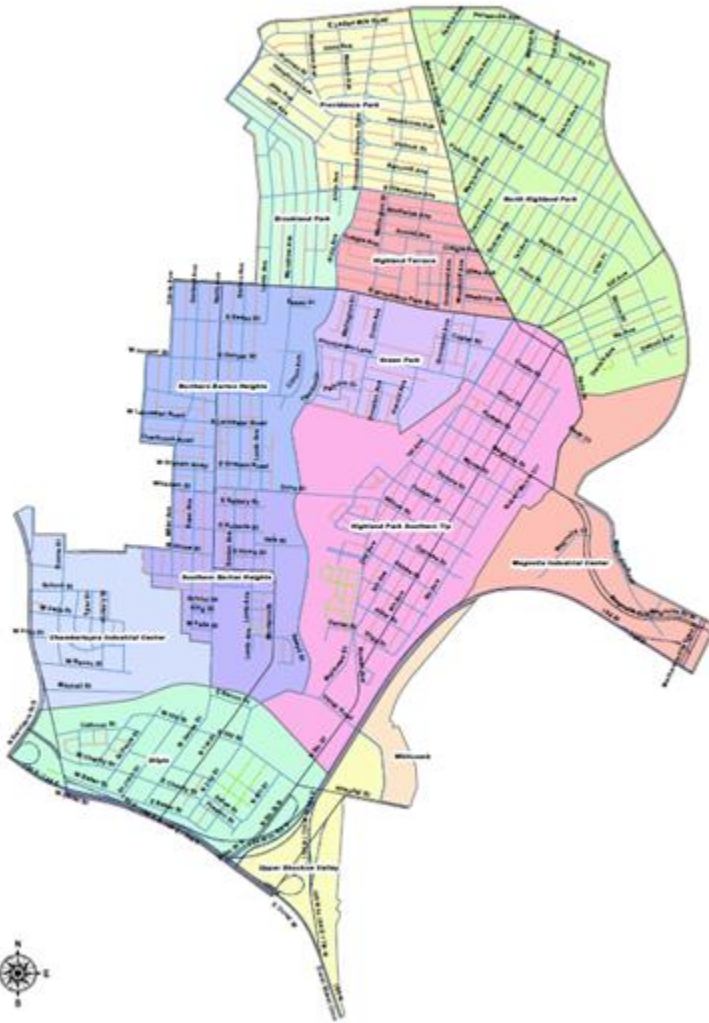
The Richmond Police Department has identified the victim and offender in the domestic-related homicide and suicide that began with a shooting on Northside Avenue last week.

At approximately 2:25 a.m. on Thursday, September 13, officers were called to the 700 block of Northside Avenue for the report of a person down. Officers arrived and found **Tanya P. Washington, 47, of the 700 block of Northside Avenue**, down and unresponsive in the roadway near the intersection of Meadowbridge Road. She had suffered a gunshot wound and was pronounced dead at the scene.

Later that same day at approximately 12:55 p.m., detectives working the investigation went to a home in the 3100 block of Letcher Avenue and found **Leon E. Willis, 57, of that same address**, down and unresponsive from an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound. Detectives believe Washington and Willis were in a relationship.
