How to protect your packages from being stolen by porch pirates





Almost <u>26 million Americans</u> (or about 8% of the US population) say they've had a package stolen from a porch or doorstep during the holidays, according to a 2017 survey.

The US Postal Service, FedEX and UPS all have systems to track your packages from the retailer to your doorstep. All three use tracking numbers that can be used to figure out where the item is and when it should be delivered to your home.

Another surefire way to thwart porch pirates is to not have packages delivered to your home at all. Many people have holiday packages delivered to their workplace or to a trusted neighbor nearby who'll be at home when the item arrives.

You've struck an online deal with a person to buy, sell or trade an item. Now what? The Richmond Police Department now offers two Safe Exchange Zones where you can meet and transact your business in well-lit areas with 24-hour video recording
