Violent crime is up over the past 28 days in comparison to this time last year. Sector 211 has seen a significant increase in robberies while aggravated assaults have remained the same.

Property crimes have increased 63%. Theft from motor vehicles and "all other larceny" (which includes theft of HVAC units and copper) have both seen the most significant increase. Please see the safety tips on Page 2 of this newsletter.



- Mark or slash inspection stickers and city decals
- Put valuables in the trunk
- Do not use your glove box as a 'safe'
- Do not leave coins in plain view
