The message stated, if you plan on going out of town for an extended amount of time. Please stop by the precinct, and fill out a House Watch form. This will be given to the patrol units, so they can keep an eye on your residence while you are out of town. The form will give the officers the days that you'll be gone, and any additional information needed to conduct the house watch.

I hope all in the community had a wonderful 4th of July and I hope everyone had fun an enjoyed any activities or events you may have planned, it was a nice day, extremely hot, but a nice day to spend time in our city. Just a reminder, the Mayor has his next town hall meeting scheduled in our sector on July 31st. It will be held in the Pine Camp civic center, it will start at 6:30pm. It's the 3rd districts town hall meeting with the Mayor. Please attend if possible. The Mayor has his department heads in attendance, and the audience is encouraged to ask them any questions you may have dealing with issues in you neighborhoods or issues you may have with the city in general.

Traffic engineering is going to push information out to eductate all of us about the bike lanes. They have printed material that's out there, an a web site detailing all facts and guideline dealing with the bike lanes. The info is for people that use the bike lanes, as well as for citizens that drive through out our sector. Place all items that will be left in you vehicle in your trunk area, out of plain view. Never leave you vehicle unattended and running, that only invites criminal activity. NEVER LEAVE YOUR PERSONAL PROPERTY UNATTENDED

The Richmond Police Department in cooperation with your local area restaurants want you to be aware and give you some simple tips to prevent being a victim of crime:

- Don't leave belongings such as bags and laptop computers unattended.
- Place items out of sight in the trunk of your vehicle prior to reaching your destination. Never leave packages in the passenger compartment unattended.
- Carry your purse close to your body. Never wrap the strap around your body.
- When in a restaurant, don't leave your handbag over the back of a chair or stool.
- Carry your wallet in the breast pocket of your jacket or in your front pants pocket. The back pocket is the easiest to pick.
