## City Introduces New Online Parking Citation Review Process

RICHMOND, Va. – The city is rolling out a new online process to streamline procedures and allow a person to submit a contested parking citation to the Parking Division's Administrative Review Board for evaluation. Parking citations, issued for any of the reasons listed below, can now be submitted online:

- Malfunctioning parking meter
- Error entering plate
- Fallen or misplaced permit or placard
- Missing, illegible, ambiguous or incorrectly worded sign
- Sign or other parking prohibition installed subsequent to parking
- Stolen or transferred vehicle
- Stolen or lost license plate
- Disabled vehicle
- Medical emergency
- Owner deceased
- Restricted Parking Permit (ticket issued in error)

After the Board reviews the request, an e-mail notification will be sent with the status of the citation and whether it will be recommended for dismissal, or what the next steps will be if the Board is unable to recommend dismissal.
