Violent crime and property crime have seen an increase this past month in Sector 211.

Violent crime has seen a 86% increase over the past 28 days in comparison to this time last year. Sector 211 had one homicide that occurred in the 200 block of Larne Avenue, five aggravated assaults, and six robberies.

Property crimes have increased by 10%. Theft from motor vehicles continues to be an issue and is up 180%. Please remember to lock your vehicles and do not leave anything of value in your cars. Don't be a victim!!

On a positive note, residential burglaries are significantly down (a 67% reduction).

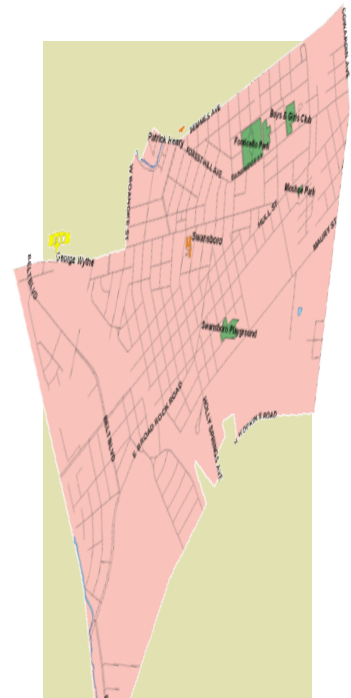

During the visit, the mentee is allowed to ask questions, talk about school or about anything else that may be of interest to the mentee. The officers are provided with character traits that are provided by the Virginia Department of Education that are discussed during the visits.

**WHAT IS THE CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY?** This **FREE** Citizens Police Academy is designed to introduce citizens to the RPD, improve relationships with RPD, help participants gain knowledge of police operations, develop stronger advocates and promote safety in the community. Sessions will include, but not be limited to: RPD patrol functions, crime prevention through environmental design, personal safety, hands-on exercises, tours within the Richmond Police Department and so much more.

**WHO MAY ATTEND?** The Academy is perfect for persons interested in a career in law enforcement or who want to learn about the law enforcement profession. Citizens are expected to attend and participate in at least 80% of the sessions.

**WHAT HAPPENS AFTER GRADUATION?** Graduates of the Citizens Police Academy officially become Volunteers in Police Services (VIPS). Members of VIPS are notified of volunteer opportunities, events, special programs and services with RPD. Graduates may be also called to participate on special boards and planning committees.
